Epic Deep Space Project Construction Tour & Presentation

With a very aggressive schedule JP Cullen set out to build an 11,500 seat auditorium and additional training spaces within Deep Space for Epic Systems in 17 months. The previous 5,500 seat Epicenter Auditorium and Voyager Hall Training Center were constructed in 27 months. Deep Space consists of 820,000 square feet distributed on five building levels below grade. Epicenter and Voyager Hall consisted of 600,000 square feet distributed over 3 above grade levels and a partial below grade level. JP Cullen looks forward to showing us around this unique project and giving us some insight into the growing world that Epic has built.

Take HWY 18/151 southwest of Madison towards Verona. Take Exit 76 (West Verona Avenue/Epic Lane). Merge onto Epic Lane going north (straight). Continue on Northern Lights Road past the Epic Campus and turn left on the construction entrance (at JP Cullen and Findorff signs). Continue on construction entrance to Annex Building - the first RED building on the right at the top of the hill. This past year has seen the start of the State of Wisconsin's requirement for continuing education for registered professionals. The branch, in its own small way, began offering Professional Development Hour (PDH) credits for many of its monthly programs. As in past years, the branch awarded scholarships to worthy civil engineering students at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville and the University of Wisconsin-Madison. This year's scholarship winners are an amazing bunch of young

people. Finally, some progress has been made in our efforts to conform to the Wisconsin Section's fiscal year. The Branch is waiting for the Section to finalize its transition to QuickBooks.

Caroline Ubung, who served as your Programs and Arrangement Chair, will be leaving to pursue graduate studies in Colorado; and Dave Staab, who served as your newsletter editor, will also be leaving the Board. A huge "thank you" is owed to both for their service to the Branch. Thank you to all who have served this past year.

This coming year, the Branch will be in the good hands of President Amanda Stone and your Board of Directors. We are also fortunate to have three new additions to the SW Branch Board. Francesca Ferrero, a graduate of Northwestern University; Jackie Gast, Leggette, Brashears & Graham, Inc.; and Laura Rozumalski, W.F. Baird & Associates will be joining the team. AND, we have candidates for the positions of President Elect and Treasurer.
